During this respite, parents get to pull away and have some much-needed time to themselves. Volunteers will be paired with one child with special needs or 2-3 siblings. No special needs experience is required!

Do you know a family who could benefit from this opportunity? Or do you have a heart to serve families affected by disability? We need volunteers to act as "Buddies" for each child that participates (buddies need to be age 12+, dependent on maturity level, although children 8 years or older can serve with a parent). Recipients are identified by ministries we support, inner city schools, social service agencies, and church members.

## Volunteer Opps

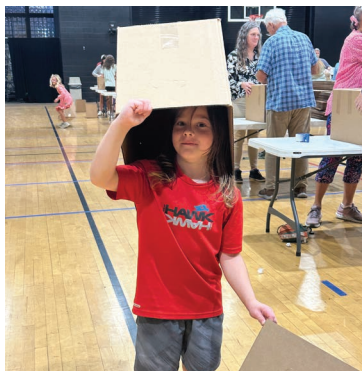


**Anytime - Postcard Coloring - Welcome Hall:** We have heard from past box recipients, especially our elderly and shut-in families, that the personalized touch of a colored card, as simple as it is, has truly made them feel seen by and connected to our church. Our desire is that every box would include a hand-colored postcard, but we can't do it without you! Would you please help us? 1,250 is a lot to color!

**Friday, November 7, 5:30-6:30 p.m. - Box Construction - CSPC Gym:** Assemble Thanksgiving boxes in the gym. Note: We will have Thanksgiving cards available for children to color while adults are assembling boxes, but no childcare will be provided, so please help us by supervising any children you choose to bring.

**Sunday, November 9, 1:00-3:00 or 3:30-5:30 p.m. - Box Fillers - CSPC Gym:** Pack boxes with 22 food items each! We need cart pushers, box openers/stuffers, as well as some strong backs to take filled boxes off carts and gently place them in rows on the gym floor. Note: All of these roles require either a lot of walking (pushing a cart through the food maze while the boxes on the cart get filled) or a lot of movement (grabbing food items from pallets and placing them in boxes on the carts). **Ages 10+**

**Monday, November 10, 8:30 a.m.-12:00 p.m. - Car Loaders - CSPC Gym:** Load boxes into vehicles. We have 1,250 boxes to get out the gym doors that morning, so our partners will be staggering their arrivals throughout the morning. Note: Although we'll be utilizing carts, the boxes are heavy and will require strong backs to load.

## KICKO: Bags of Hope

► In 2016, a couple on KICKO's staff heard about children traveling through foster care with their belongings in trash bags. That was an astonishing thought and an unforgettable moment. When children are removed from their biological homes, it is often a stressful situation, and at times, the child's most beloved items and clothes are put in a trash bag for their social worker to take.

KICKO (a CSPC Local Mission ministry partner) is changing this narrative in Tennessee by providing each child with a personalized duffle bag filled with age-appropriate comfort items. We invite you to provide hope to kids during their most traumatic moments by providing something personal, that is theirs, and that lovingly communicates that they matter and belong.



We are on a mission to raise enough to cover the cost of a \$25 duffle bag (filled and embroidered) for each child in foster care in our city. Beginning on November 16th, we will be selling Christmas ornaments that each have the name and age of a child currently in the foster care system in East Tennessee. We encourage you to hang these ornaments somewhere in your home or business as a reminder to pray for that child throughout the year! **ABOUT:** KICKO (Knoxville Inner City Kids Outreach) is a mobile ministry that builds relationships and develops faith with Knoxville's city kids. 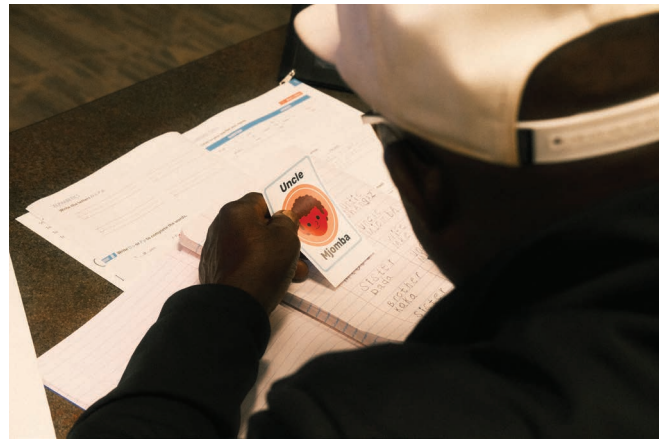
Ways that you can help meet needs and serve our refugee community include:
